Habitat: Ponderosa and piñon pines, one-seeded and Rocky Mtn. junipers and misc. other trees.

While birding in City Park I observed a warbler flycatching in the top area of a ponderosa pine. I then pshished and the bird came down to about 8 feet from me. The bird had a bright yellow face & crown, black throat, white breast except the upper part which was black, two white wing bars on gray wings, a dark gray back and black nape & lower half of the back of the head. The bird was feeding around the male cones and new bud areas on the pine It then flew down to a lower branch directly in front of me at about five feet. The bird was in direct sunlight at this time. I then noted the dark legs, dark eye, white sides with black streaks running down them, and the tail(which was slightly forked, dark on top, and white underneath) I then knew it was a hermit warbler. I left to go home and get my camera. I returned a little later and found it. The bird was again in the top of the tree. I tried to get a picture but a street cleaner scared the bird off. I didn't see which direction it went.

Conclusions: I have no doubts that the bird was a Hermit Warbler.

- 1. The bright yellow face and crown
- 2. The black throat and upper breast
- 3. The black nape
- 4. The dark gray back
- 5. The gray wings with two white wingbars
- 6. The white breast, belly, and flanks
- 7. The white sides with black streaks running down them These were the major field marks I observed.

Similar species: Black-throated Green Warbler

- 1. Olive-green crown and back
- 2. black sides
- 3. I've seen only one, a female last Sept. in the Pueblo area.

Townsend's Warbler:

- 1. Black face and crown
- 2. yellow breast
- 3. I've seen lots of them in Colo. and Ariz. each Fall

Hooded Warbler

1. yellow-breast, belly, back, wings
