## C.F.O. SIGHT RECORD

Species: Piping Plover

Locality: On the South East side of the Cherry Creek Reservoir, where Cherry Creek enters the reservoir

Date: May 17, 1975. Two birds were seen at 9:00 a.m. and again at 7:30 p.m. I did not check to see if they were there the following day.

Observers: Ken and Kathryn Whipple at 9:00 a.m. Mildred Snyder at 7:30 p.m.

Equipment: Bausch and Lomb scope set at 20 power and Leitz 8x40B binoculars were used during the morning Hensoldt 40 power scope was used during the 7;30 p.m. sighting.

<u>Habitat</u>: On the shore of Cherry Creek Reservoir, right out on the sand bars feeding.

Discription: This was a very pale bird, creamy back, white tummy and a black neck band. The legs were yellow so was the bill. There was a balck marking on top the head. There was a Semi-Palmated Plover feeding near the piping plovers.

Conclusion: Once I saw the yellow legs and bill, sandy back and complete neck band there was no doubt.

Experience: This was not a new bird for me as I had seen it severaltimes in Texas on the coast.
