Field marks observed: size, color, pattern, shape, bill, etc.: About twice size of Pied-billed Grebe(s) nearby. Body bigger, in proportion,

than Eared/Horned. General color, black and white.

Black cap; black or dark line down back of neck; whitish face and cheek, divided by a dusky vertical line from a white patch on the back side of the head, which may have lapped across the nape. Head had angular shape.

Bill yellow at base, dark at end; longer than Horned/Eared, shorter than Western/Clark's. Held bill angled down.

Neck longer than Pied-billed, perhaps equal in proportion to Eared/Horned, not as long as Western/Clark's. Front of neck and chest whitish to water line; back of neck grayish or darker.

Back grayish or darker, lower neck (front) and chest whitish to water line.

Bird's call or song: Silent

Field marks not seen:

Similar species: Horned/Eared: different shape, smaller bills, smaller birds.

Western: different shape, longer bill, longer neck, strong contrast between black and white on head and neck.

Prior experience: Have seen one or two at Chatfield in the fall.
