I HAVE SEEN SEVERAL RUDDY TURNSTONES, IN BOTH SPRING AND FALL MIGRATION IN MINNESOTA. IT CAN BE COMMON IN A FEW LOCALES. I HAVE ALSO SEEN OVERWINTERING BIRDS IN TEXAS.

QUITE A BIT OF THE BLACK CONCENTRATED ON THE FRONT OF THE BIRD. THE BILL, CHIN, THROAT AND BREAST WERE BLACK. THE BLACK BIB MENTIONED FORMED A DISTINCT BORDER SEPARATING THE CLEAN WHITE BELLY. THE LEAS AND FEET WERE RED. ORANGE IN COLOR. THE UPPER BACK WAS A RUST COLORBO PATCH THAT FOLLOWED ALONA THE TOP EDGE OF THE BLACK SCAPULARS. BELOW THIS, THE COVERTS WERE A RUST COLOR. WHILE THE BIRD WAS WALKING, THE FOLDED PRIMARIES WERE BLACK HOWEVER, IN FLIGHT THE WING HAD A LONG BROAD WHITE STRIPE EXTENDING THROUGH THE FLIGHT FEATHER ALSO IN FLIGHT, THE WHITE RUMP, BLACK UPPERTAIL COVERTS, AND WHITE TAIL WITH BROAD BLACK SUBTERMINA BAND WERE BRIEFLY SEEN. IT IS WHEN IN FLIGHT THAT THE STRIKING THREE COLORED PATTERN OF THIS BIRD WAS BEST OBSERVED.
