Description: This bird was about same size as Lazuli Bunting, Though close in overall color to smaller dull? or immature Lesser GoldFinch. It was dull olive green above including crown and face, but lighter greenish-yellow below becoming a bit paler yellow in belly and brighter yellow in vent with contrasting white under Tail coverts onl near Tail, Vent and rest of undertail coverts were yellow. Wings were Olive green in coverts melding into Smoky gray primaries. There were no wing bars nor patches visible in wing, when bird was perched or in Flight. Tail was greenish besally becoming grayish distally. It was fairly long, slightly more Than 1 body length of bird. Bill was conical shaped with slightly decurved culmenand gape. It had a dark perimeter & became a lighter straw color towards gape.

In addition to lacking wingbars, this bird exhibited no streaking, not even Faint streaking, on back or underparts.
