This bird stood head and shaulders above Long-billed Dowitchers with which it fed, I would guess it to be about 18" long as big as a Marbled Godwit but with a much shorter more recurved lill than M. Gadwit. Overall bird was dark (appeared blackish at a distance). Was blackish above w/ white speckling on the back. Undersides (bely & breast) very dark chestruit, deeper & darker colored than dowitchers. Face & sides of neck gray & lighter than inder-sides. Fairly strong pale whitish superciliary. Bill med-length strongly up-curved & deep orange except at dark tip. Legs long & dark. Bid not seen in flight

Bill much longer, straighter. Face tan not whitish gray. Bartailed & Black-tailed Hodivits, both dark brown above (not blackish), are not deep reddish below.
