

was the 1st gull he located. A very small, very
lean 1st summer bird. The wing filled with very
striking of blackish with primaries and a very black
terminal bar extending from the base in the wing
down to the trailing edge/terminal area. Along the
trailing edge of the secondary's were some dark
smudgy spots. In flight the overall impression
was a broken ~~AN~~ ^{AN} white triangle on the
bottom of the ~~AN~~ ^{AN}. The white tail had a thin black
band across the tip.
The small round head had a smudgy dark
crown, and a single round black spot just below
the eye in the carotid area. The bill was pink
smaller black smaller than BOBV.
we watched this gull for 1/2 hr.
