I observed a small heron with three great blues. This heron was dark gray on wings and its back. It was a reddish brown from its head to its breast including its neck. The bill was a light gray with black tip. The bird had dark legs. The bird faced the opposite direction so, I couldn't see the breast very well. But the breast wasn't white.
