- head + neck - couldn't determine much of a
difference between these parts and the above
mentioned regions. Head + neck plumage was
smooth, not shaggy.Other parts - bill - somewhat bluish & tipped with black,
and definitely not flesh-colored
- legs - didn't note the color, but in general,
were dark.

How were similarly appearing species eliminated? I felt the only other species it might be was the reddish egret. I eliminated it primarily on the basis of feeding behavior, bill coloration, and texture of head and neck plumage.
