Description: While scanning the pond with my binoculars I saw two medium-sized white herons that I believed were Snowy Egrets. After looking in the scope I discovered one of the birds was a Little Blue Heron. The bird differed from the Snowy Egret in having a thicker bill-especially noticeable at the base. The basal 1/3 of the bill was pale bluish. The legs were completely dark yellow-olive. Finally, the bird had slate-colored primary tips that were visible at some distance.

Similar Species: Immature Snowy Egrets never show dark primary tips, have more slender bills, usually have yellow bleeding up the back of dark legs, and do not have a pale bluish base to the bill (although they can show paler bases to the bill).
