After chasing the darn bird about this steep scrabbly, bushy hill, I finally looked down into the bush from which he sang, and saw a yellow cap and black and white marks on the face, gray back. fácé/ Thta was the last I saw of him, although he stuck around for another 10-20 minutes, still singing.

Doug Stotz and Paul Julian did see all of him, though from below, and confirmed my initizal identification. Actually, what I saw of him was diagnostic, although a bit sketchy for justifying a rare state record.

The only similar faces belong to the Black-throated Gray and Black-andwhite, which don't have yellow camps and don't impress you as gray birds.
