AS ON THE THREAT OF A MARE LOOKED ABOUT THE SAME THROAT OF THIS BIRD COLOR AUDUBON'S WARBLER, BUT WAS LOWSIDERABLY MORE EXTENSIVE REACHING DOWN TO ABOUT THE MID-CHEST. THE LOWER BREYAST AND BELLY WERE WHITE AND THE FLANKS WERE BOLDLY STREPAKED WITH BLACK. THE FACE PATTERN WAS ALSO VERY DISTINCTIVE WITH THE WHITE PATCH BEHIND THE VERY NOTICEABLE. THIS, ALONG WITH THE BOLD WHITE EVELINE EAR CONSTRASTS STRONGLY WITH THE BLACK OF THE FACE. THE SMALL WHITE PATCH BELOW THE EYE WAS ALSO PRESENT. HAD 2 STRONG WHITE WING BARS, BUT BACK COLOR WAS HARD TO SEE BECAUSE OF THE POTR LIGH THE BIRD Describe the bird's song and call, if given, including method of delivery, (i.e. from perch, in flight, duration):

YELLOW RUMPED WARBLER - DIRECT COMPARISON - ONLY YELLOW ON THIS BIRD WAS ON THERAT, AND MORE EXTENSIVE. GRACE'S WARBLER - THIS BIRD HAD BLACK FACE PATCH, WHITE PATCH BEHIND OHR, AND BOLD WHITE EYELINE. MAGNOWA WARBLER - THIS BIRD HAD WHITE BEHIND CAR, WHITE EYELWE TO BILL, WHITE BELLY, NO BREAST BAND. COMBURATION OF FACE PATTERN, YELLOW THRAFT (EXTENSIVE) AND WHITE WINGBARS ELIMINATES OTHER WARBLERS. What is your prior experience with this and similarly appearing species?
