AMERICA MENTIONS AS CHARACTERISTIC. AFTER MENTIONS AS CHARACTERISTIC, AFTER BIRD FLOW OFF, I LISTENED TO THE RECORD THAT ARLOW PAWIES PETERSONS Description of voice, if heard: WESTERN BIRDS & THIS HELPED ME TO MAKE THE IDENTIFICATION.
