

## VERIFYING DOCUMENTATION OF AN UNUSUAL RECORD

1. Species: Cuff Crested Sandpiper *Tryngites subruficollis* 2. Number: 1

3. Location: C&D lakes, 7 miles south of Pueblo, Colorado4. Date(s): Oct 6, 19685. Time bird seen: late afternoon to 5 or 10 minutes

6. Description of size, shape and color-pattern. (Describe in great detail all parts of the plumage including beak and feet coloration in addition to the diagnostic characteristics; however, include only what actually was seen in the field): A medium sized sandpiper with brownish or tan overall appearance especially belly and breast, short bill - very definitely stood out with the numerous other smaller sandpipers - toment, baird's least, and semipalmated which covered the mud flats - it was not wary, I was able to approach within 100 feet of it and observe it carefully for several minutes

7. Description of voice, if heard: none heard

8. Description of behavior: mostly standing, some feeding - no rapid movements remembered - more typical shorebird behavior

9. Habitat - general: short grass prairie

specific: mud-flats from receding shallow lake
