Singing from perch, high ascending <sup>vans</sup> notes  
faster & slightly buzzy at end.

deciduous thickets along creek at base  
of foothills

How were similarly appearing species eliminated?

First thought Magnolia but ~~the~~ yellow &  
black face pattern (and no tail spots) determined Prairie (Townsend's  
has black throat.) Later saw red streaking  
on back. Song was also determinate!

Island)
