

## VERIFYING DOCUMENTATION OF AN UNUSUAL RECORD

1. Species: BAY-BREASTED WARBLER *Dendroica castanea* 2. Number: 1  
(vernacular name) (scientific name)

3. Location: ~~Frost Yards~~ - same, side - (could be termed foothills.)

4. Date(s): June 3, 1973 5. Time bird seen: 8<sup>30</sup> AM to 8<sup>35</sup> AM

5½". Warbler contour, chestnut crown, Breast & crown  
DARK BLACKISH FACE & BACK, DARK legs, white wing BARS  
Beak DARK - whitish underparts.

I really got a very good look at this bird and obtained an immediate positive identification - see three large front window. The bird sat still long enough for us to verify with picture in book.

8. Description of behavior: - feeding off of leaves on Washington Hawthorn - hopping rapidly - WARBLER fashion - rapidly about tree -

9. Habitat - general: Frost YARD - WITH 4 fruit trees - evergreens - conifers  
specific: IN Hawthorn Tree

Chestnut-sided & Blackburnian because of vivid coloring - wing BARS, + striped or colored head -

clear DAY. Light about BIRD - sun DID NOT blur or diffuse color or

Have seen 5 species of warbler - my immediate reaction was that it was a Blackburnian Warbler.

One was reported in newsletter / wk later & was stated to be unusual
