Bob Brown first found the bird on 12-26-00. It was Jesting on the ground at the edge of a small cattoril-filled swall next to a paved footpath at cherry Creek stille Park, On count day, 1-1-01, two members of our party Saw the brief feeding at that spot about 7:15 am (summine) At about 8:15 am, omentire party of 12 was positioned about 100 ft. from the spot, with the sun to our facts. About six Song Spanows and one American The Sparrow were feeling of the spot, In a few minuter, the Golden- crowned was found in the dense brancher of a small free partially obscured; but all party mention observed it w/ binoculars. I trained my scope on the bird, but only I save it through the scope, before it ducked with the cottonils. Moments later, the bird began Justing in the open for a good view no scope required. All observes identified it as Goden- Crowned Sparrow. We saw a large sparrow clear gray-breated, with a pale golden erown containing fine black streats. The gold color was most apparent and quite pronounced who struck by full surlight. The patel of streated gold had longitudinal charcoal borders, truggesting an adult, The bird was longer than the Song Sparrow, but of similar shape and structure. The wings were, refour and black w/ two faint white wingbars. The back was brownish with darker streaks. The bill was grayist. The golden crown is sufficient to distinguish the bird from the three other Zonotrichia specien which occur in Colorado in the winter. I and many of my party have considerable experience w/ Zonotrichia sparrows, and experience no doubt about our ID.

Description:

A Golden-crowned Sparrow had been reported since Dec 26, 2001 in the same patch of woods along the bike path near a parking lot on the SW corner of the lake. I went there with several others to look for this bird. After waiting for it to appear for several minutes, I finally spotted it coming out to feed on some bird seed that someone had placed along the bike path. It was a large sparrow, notably a *Zonotrichia* by size. It was predominantly brownish on the upperparts with faint streaking on the wings and whitish on the underparts, although the unstreaked breast had a dingy brown tone to it. The most distinctive feature was the deep yellow crown patch bordered by black feathering along the sides of the crown. After seeing the crown patch I didn't bother looking at the rest of the bird for plumage details

Describe the bird's song and call, if given, including method of delivery (i.e. from perch, in flight, duration): none heard

What is your prior experience with this and similarly-appearing species? I have seen 100's of this species while living in Alaska and California. This is the third GCSP I have seen in Colorado in two years.
