Observation Comments:	The bird was moving about silently in a ditch beneath cottonwood trees. Hermit thrush and graycheeked thrush were considered as possibilities for identification. One of the three photos shows some color contrast between the tail and body, suggestive of a hermit thrush, but lighting in the shade appears to be uneven and misleading. Instead, the faint, incomplete eyeing and the slender nature of the bird suggest it is a gray-cheeked thrush.
